01 Saturday • Disaster Relief & Rehabilitation, Bhutan
Pray for continued rehabilitation for families and communities impacted by flooding at the India-Bhutan border in late June.

Pastor Jagan*, our Bhutan director, organized a relief project for 50 families facing the greatest need. “Prayers appreciated for the people residing at temporary shelter [near the border] who are going through hard times after heavy rainfall flooded their residence. By God’s grace there were not any casualties.”

“At this time in our area, the conditions are not good due to BJP (ruling political party) and RSS (Hindu extremist group) activity. Now the government brought an anti-Christian bill, and we are not able to openly conduct Sunday worship regularly.” Biju*, M32

08 Saturday • Disaster Relief & Rehabilitation, Myanmar
Praise God for a few hundred families who recently received food supplies from our local leaders after being forced to flee their homes due to active fighting in their villages.

“As a widow caring for my elderly mother and young children, fleeing the violence was overwhelming. We reached [the safe town] completely exhausted and empty-handed. Finding shelter in a crowded community building without proper sanitation has been hard, but knowing that our food needs are taken care of for the next month takes a massive burden off my shoulders. We are incredibly grateful for the help.” Vung*

"It was amazing that we were able to stand beside a lot of communities and believers' families who were suffering for drinking water. This is a big village where a lot of non-believers and believers are combinedly living. They are situated on the bank of a river. But this water is so bitter that cattle could not drink as per the bitterness. They struggle due to the swamp and heavy flooding, which has made life a fight to survive. In this kind of situation, our church planting ministry was able to stand beside a lot of communities with rain water reserve tanks. I can say, it has been done well and good." Monday • Disaster Relief & Rehabilitation, India

Pray for communities living through extreme heat and drought in western India.

Pray for the success of clean water pump projects that Pastor Thomas*, a regional director, organizes: "We have done either a handpump and handset, or otherwise motor. The ones with a handset/handpump are the best, because of the remote areas where they are unable to use electricity for a motor. 300 people came to get water from [a recent] well because there are no other places or because electricity gets cut, then others come to get water from there. This is helpful for agriculture, and then also the church will receive vegetables and produce that the church will benefit from. Society cuts these people out [by persecution], but then when a lot of water comes, they can use it for benefitting the entire society and community."
